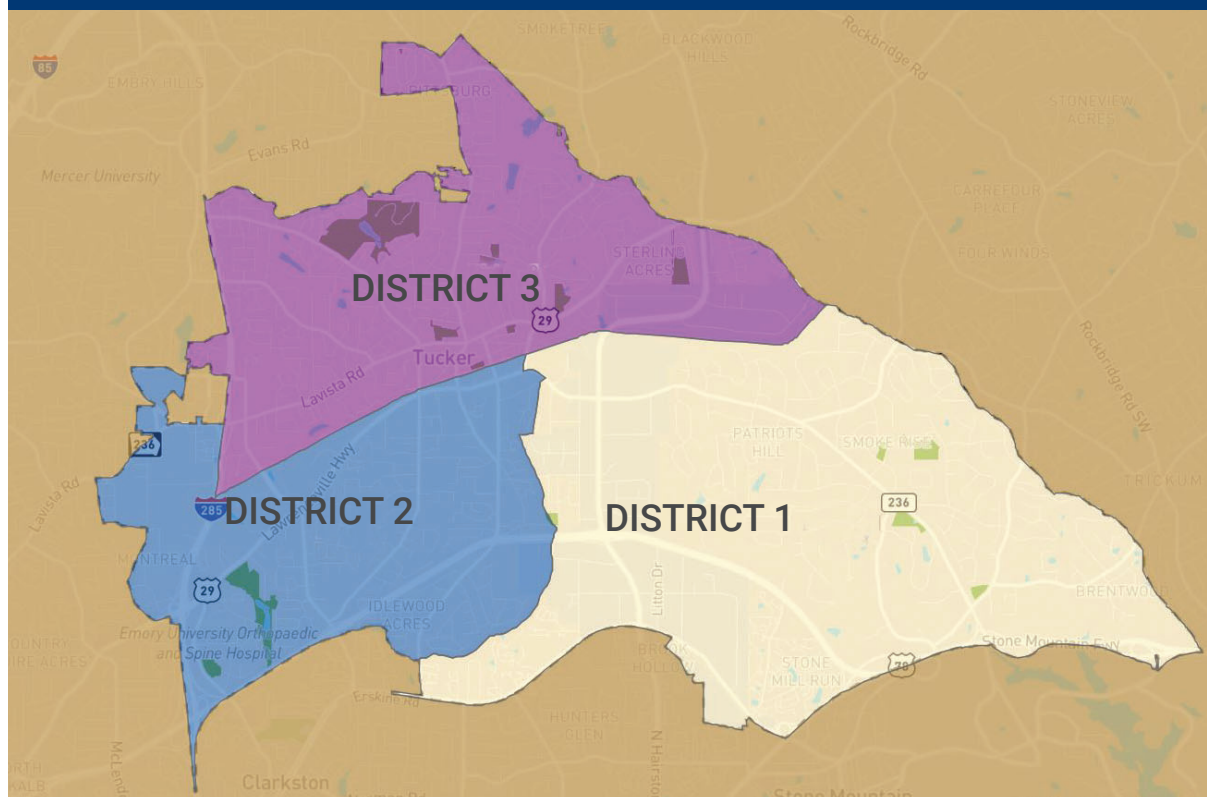

This summer will be the eighth anniversary of the Summer of Fun, unbelievable! Back in 2017 on my first day as a City staff member,

I was told that I needed

to organize a National Night Out block party for around 200 people for the following week! I worked with local food trucks, negotiated deals, worked with the school PTA and got it done. That set the tone for the creation of the TKR Summer of Fun.

Immediately, we wanted to go bigger and add more events. We contracted with a fireworks company that was already booked for July 4, 2018 so we went with July 3 for the inaugural Celebration of Independence and Fireworks Spectacular. I like to do almost everything in sets of three, so we added a Movie on Main night.

The first TKR Summer of Fun was a huge success! Movie on Main aired The Greatest Showman with free popcorn and drinks, with a special side of a train whistle. The July 3 Celebration of Independence and Fireworks

Spectacular set a record for attendance that has been broken every year since. The second annual National Night Out was a resounding success and confirmed the tone of the relationship with the school district.

The initial budget for the TKR Summer Fun was a total of \$40,000 for all three so I definitely secured sponsors which just extended our reach and partnership with area businesses. Since 2022 the events line item and responsibility live in Parks and Recreation with a dedicated events planning team. They have multiplied the number and types of events so that now it is a rare weekend, in the spring through fall that does not have an opportunity to gather. With the opening of the Tucker Town Green, our summer is going to be even more fun!

SPRING IS IN THE AIR WITH A DASH OF ASPHALT

It is time for the City of Tucker's spring re-surfacing. Every year, Tucker repaves the roads based on a scoring system of need. The City of Tucker contracted with Roadway Asset Services to conduct a pavement management study to prioritize which roads should be treated this year. Roadway Asset Services uses state-of-the-art technology to scan the roads for conditions below the surface, detect cracks, potholes and other potentially hazardous road conditions.

Re-surfacing will start in June and is a multi-step process that starts with milling, which removes the top two to three inches of road, followed by an overlay of asphalt to create a smooth surface. Heavy equipment is used so please exercise caution while driving near the projects. Projects are selected in clusters so there is less movement of the heavy machinery and a smaller chance of damaging recently re-surfaced roads.

With the help of Road Asset Services' data, Tucker's engineering team identified 29 sections of road that were in urgent need of repair, including:

Lee Way, Settlement Road, Johns Road, Strapp Drive, Woodlawn Circle, Lavista Woods Drive, Crestcliff Court, Milestone Run, Camelot Court, Lilburn Stone Mountain Road, Spring Glenn Drive, Silver Hill Trail, Ashbrooke Trace, East Gate Trail, East Gate Court, Kanawha Drive, Chedworth Drive, Chedworth Cove, Britt Road, Lake Ivanhoe Drive, Debracy Pace, Locksley Court, Locksley Road, Middleham Court, Lady Rowena Court, Templar Knight Drive, Rotherwood Drive and Webb Road.

WHAT HAPPENED AT THE LAST CITY COUNCIL MEETING?

APRIL 2026 CITY COUNCIL RECAP

Tucker's City Council business meeting was held April 13 and started with two proclamations declaring May 3-9 as Municipal Clerk's Week and May 4-8 as Economic Development Week. Two special presentations followed. First, the Council approved a resolution to name the new ADA accessible playground at Fitzgerald Field the Olivia Hayes Memorial Playground. Olivia tragically passed away on September 1, 2008. She was a vibrant child and an active cheerleader with the Tucker Football League at Fitzgerald. DeKalb County School District then presented an update on the Student Assignment Project, their proposal to right-size the schools' buildings, boundaries and programs.

The Mayor and City Council approved the evening's agenda unanimously with an amendment to remove item K.4. and move it to the May business meeting. The consent agenda was also approved unanimously and included meeting minutes from March, renewal of the City's insurance contract with Georgia Interlocal Risk Management Agency, renewal of the BS&A software contract, a contract with Trinity Unity and two stormwater contracts.

This meeting was the first public viewing of the proposed Fiscal Year 2027 Budget which can be found at tuckerga.gov/documents and is also available in print at City Hall.

The Mayor and Council made the following votes:

- 7-0: Ordinance O2026-03-02 - Second read and public hearing of an ordinance for a Special Land Use Permit (SLUP-26-0001) to allow for a vocational school at 5066 Lavista Road for Care One Institute, LLC.
- Voted 0-7 to be re-evaluated and brought back to the Council: Ordinance O2026-03-03 - second read and public hearing on an ordinance to amend the Comprehensive Plan to update the Transportation and Trails Master Plan
- 7-0: Resolution R2026-04-1 - Consideration and public hearing of a resolution to approve the execution of documents relating to the acquisition of land for a Public Works facility.
- 7-0: IGA No. CID.2026.0.1 - Consideration of an Intergovernmental Agreement for joint funding of the North-South Royal Industrial Streetlight District with Tucker Summit CID
- 7-0: Resolution R2026-04-13 - Consideration of a resolution and public hearing to create Streetlight District 2026-001North/South Royal Industrial
- 7-0: Contract C2026-PO26-1334 - Consideration of a contract for lighting

services with Georgia Power for Streetlight District 2026-001 North-South Royal Industrial

- 7-0: Resolution R2026-04-14 - Consideration of a resolution to amend Fiscal Year 2026 budget, for the added revenue and expense of the new CID Streetlight District
- 7-0: Ordinance O2026-04-05 - First read and required approval of an Ordinance to amend Article IV of City Charter (Municipal Court)

The following item had its a first read with an expected vote the first meeting of May:

- Ordinance O2026-04-04 - First read and public hearing of an ordinance to amend the City of Tucker City Code Chapter 46

The Council recessed to executive session, returned with no further action and adjourned.

The City Council's scheduled work session for April 27 will focus on the proposed Fiscal Year 2027 budget and the 10-year CIP.

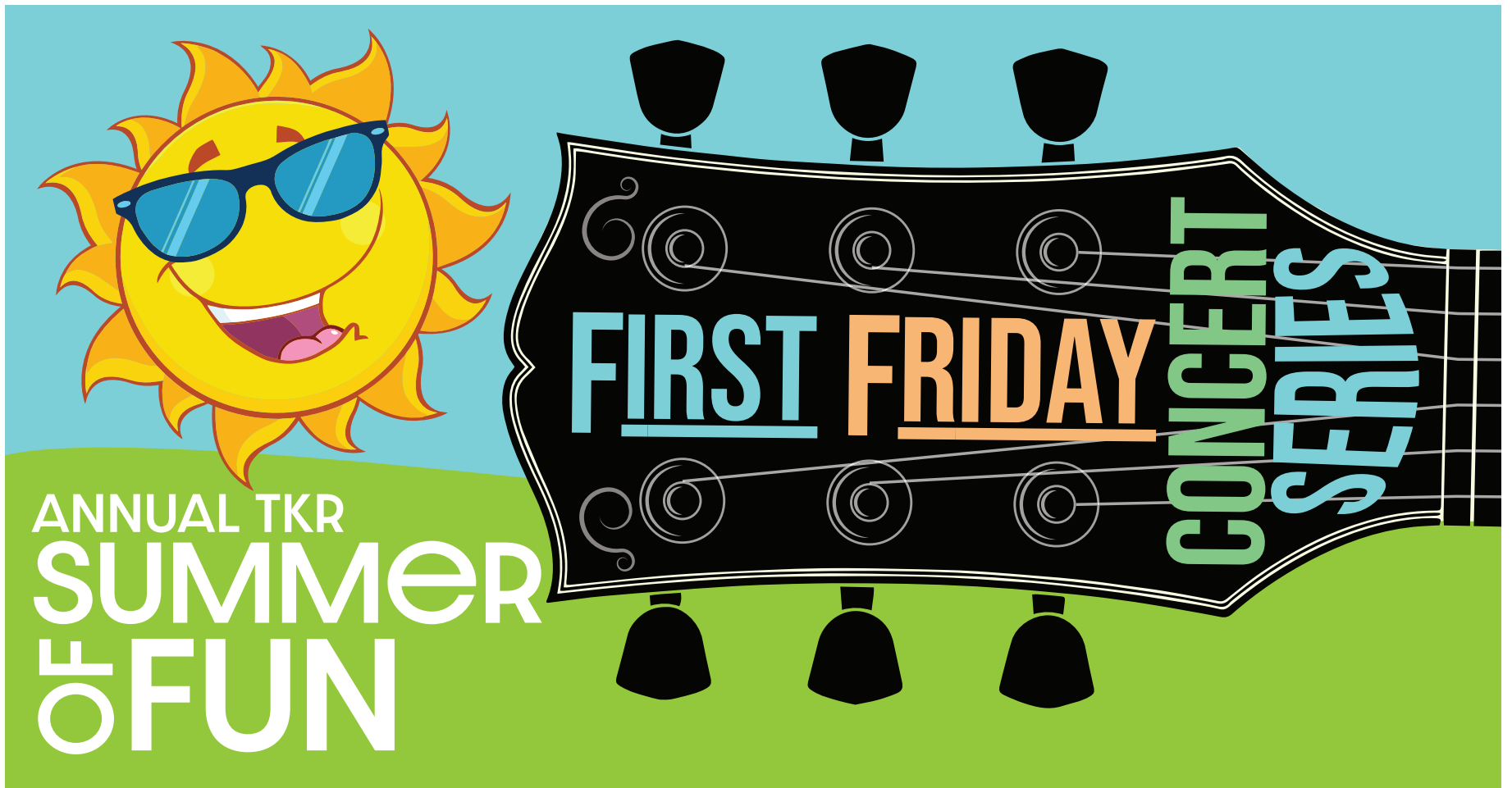



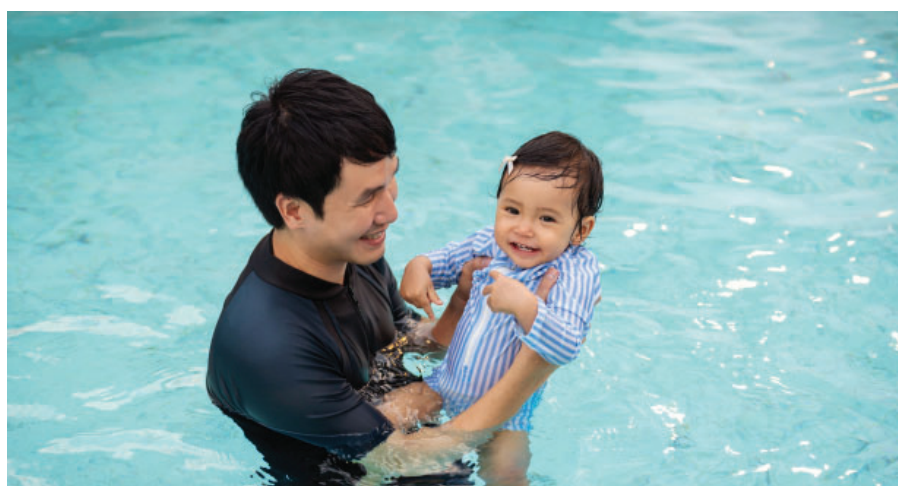

While not an official participant in our TKR Summer of Fun, our pools offer a great opportunity to expand your fun this summer. Tucker Parks and Recreation is pleased to offer extended pool hours, swim lessons and new events this year as we welcome Aquatics Coordinator Madeleine Leavitt to our department. We'd love to see you at our Preview Weekend May 16-17 and/or on Memorial Day weekend, May 23-25 before the pools officially open for the season at 4 p.m. on May 29. We think our community will also be happy to know that both pools are now open seven days a week during the height of the summer season.

BUSINESS OF THE MONTH

CHALLENGES GAMES & COMICS

During the late 1980s and early 1990s, Tony Cade worked in the catalog order department at JCPenney in Northlake Mall. Today, he remains a fixture of that same mall, though his role has evolved significantly. As the founder and owner of Challenges Games & Comics (CGC), Cade now manages an 8,000-square-foot destination that serves as a hub for pop culture enthusiasts. The shop offers a vast selection of merchandise in addition to hosting community events, gaming tournaments, and expos.

Cade's journey began over 50 years ago with a childhood passion for titles like Batman and Fantastic Four. Initially, he read them purely for entertainment, but a chance encounter with a neighbor changed his perspective. After seeing a meticulously organized, plastic-wrapped collection, Cade realized that comics were more than just stories; they were potential investments. He successfully convinced his father to fund his hobby under this investment strategy, eventually amassing a personal collection of over 15,000 issues.

This lifelong hobby eventually turned into a business. Cade first entered the industry by partnering with a friend to launch Quatom Comics on Ponce De Leon. When that partnership ended, Cade struck out on his own. He moved into a space formerly occupied by Challenges Amusement Arcade at the North

DeKalb Mall. Drawing on the nostalgia of the location, he incorporated "Challenges" into his new store's name.

After a decade at North DeKalb Mall, redevelopment plans forced a relocation. Cade chose to move to Northlake Mall, drawn by the spacious floor plan and the security of the environment. In the three years since the move, CGC has become a vital community resource. The store hosts free expos featuring industry luminaries such as Emmy Award winning animator Lauren Brown, known for her work on Archer. Other guests have included contributors to Dragon Ball Z, Diary of a Wimpy Kid, Marvel, and DC Comics, alongside notable figures like Milton Davis, Dawud Anyabwile, and Don Hilsman II.

Looking toward the future, Cade plans to expand CGC's educational offerings. He is currently developing classes, including a voice acting course led by Bob Carter, a veteran of over 100 projects including Mortal Kombat.

Although he started as a child reading for fun, Cade continues to learn and grow alongside his business. Located near the Northlake Mall food court, Challenges Games & Comics stands as a testament to a passion that turned into a career.

LUIS FINLEY

Luis organized so many community events that once Tucker incorporated and wanted to start hosting events, it only made sense that he and OTTMA would partner up and help. Because of his help and support, the inaugural July 3 Celebration of Independence and Fireworks Spectacular was a huge success and laid the foundation for the growth of the entire TKR Summer of Fun series.

To add to it, he is kind and funny. He approaches all things in a calm manner and always finds a way to make everything fun. The Local 7 and Ford's BBQ are successful beacons on Main Street because of his leadership, grace and hard work ethic. These strengths filter down to a staff



that sticks around and has also become part of the Tucker family.
